OpenAI API Key seemingly exposed on portfolio website

If real then web scrapers could run up a bill so fast.

Not obviously fake sample key so I would reject you if I saw that.

Wouldn't even be able to get to the link after it passed through a resume scanner

Some Resume scanners try to extract the text...needs normal formatting. advanced ones use Word2Vec or Transformers to only pickup on buzzwords/phrases used in sentences that make sense.
